Engineering:

• Emanuel Stoltzfus' Land Development plan for 265 Killian Road was reviewed by the Planning Commission at their November meeting and they gave preliminary approval.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Beam made the motion to approve the preliminary/final plan with certain conditions and waivers and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.

Zoning Report:

- 1032 N. Manor Road Found guilty at District Court on December 1 and fines will be assessed.
- <u>344 N. Manor Road</u> Owner has begun clean-up of property.
- <u>3183 Ridge Road</u> Owner complied, and clean-up is almost completed.
- 8 resale inspections, 12 building inspections, and 3 permits were issued in November.

Solicitor's Report:

- Ms. Venzie gave an update on the codification that is underway and that the process involves updating and cleaning up township ordinances. She will provide further information to the Board by the February meeting.
- The kennel ordinance was presented for review which would amend the existing ordinance to only allow kennels in commercial and industrial areas. This will be reviewed by the Planning Commission at their December meeting.
- Michael Kerr, DigEntGrp requested a 6-month extension for his planning module.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Beam made the motion to grant Mr. Kerr a 6-month extension and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.

Planning Commission:

• Reviewed the revised plans for the Emanuel Stoltzfus Land Development plans for 265 Killian Road with the recommendation that the Board grant approval.

Roads:

- Plows and salt spreaders are installed and ready for use by the snow removal team. Salt supplies are adequate for the pending storm.
- Cleaned ditches on Killian and Germany Hollow Roads to alleviated flooding during heavy rains.
- Excavated and repaired inlet boxes on Huntsfield Drive.
- Bollinger Road Bridge discussed the damages that occurred in the December 3 accident and necessary repairs. Installation of guard rails will be considered to prevent future damage.

Parks and Recreation:

• Dusk to dawn light has been installed at the pavilion.

EMS:

- Discussed COVID-19 PPE response from the county to provide necessary equipment to requestors.
- Chester County has preparations in place for pending storm.
- Responded to request from St. Mary's of Providence for water assistance during time when well pumps were not functional.
- Mr. Hargreaves advised that the township radios were fully functional and that two more had been requested for the township.

NEW BUSINESS:

• <u>Security Cameras</u> - Shawn Blickley reviewed the proposals for camera installation in and around the township building.

<u>Motion</u>: Mr. Elston made the motion to approve the proposal to install the proposal to install 8 security cameras in and around the building at a cost of \$1752.43 and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.

• <u>Job Applicant</u> – Reviewed the application from Joshua Beam for the seasonal position of snowplow operator. Mr. King interviewed the applicant and recommended approval.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Elston made the motion to approve Joshua Beam for the seasonal position of snowplow operator and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 2-0 with Nelson beam abstaining.

- <u>Correspondence</u> Discussed concern from resident of New Road regarding dead trees on a neighboring property and possible damages.
- Computers Mr. Daniel will provide a proposal for laptops for the next meeting.
- <u>2021 Budget</u> Reviewed proposed budget and changes needed to breakdown expenses to subcategories.

Motion: Mr. Daniel made the motion to approve the 2021 budget with recommended changes and was seconded by Mr. Beam. Motion carried 3-0.
