Engineering:

- Yoder Road culvert temporary and permanent construction easements are needed for adjacent properties and will go to bid in February or March for Summer, 2024 installation.
- Fidelity Contracting plan will be reviewed at the next Planning Commission meeting.
- 11 Fairview Road new plan submitted reducing the number of lots from 18 to 7.
- Hammell-O'Donnell Business Park sketch plan for one lot was submitted and will be held until the whole plan is approved.

Zoning Report:

- Reviewed correspondence from a resident regarding zoning reviews.
- 277 Killian Road damaged and inoperable vehicles are in the front yard. Notice will be sent to the property owner.
- 3020 Creek Road question on work being performed before permits are issued. Mr. Kologie stated that issues regarding zoning and stormwater management are under review.
- Goodfellow Road many vehicles parked on the road which will impede snow removal. Ms. Venzie will review zoning for placement of "No Parking" signs along road.
- Mr. Elston asked for weekly inspections of the Township for zoning violations.

Solicitor's Report:

- Reviewing ordinance regarding acreage for horses. Guidance is expected from the court on cases in other municipalities.
- Short-term rentals and Property Maintenance will be reviewed in February.

Planning Commission:

- Reviewed the amended plan for 11 Fairview Road.
- Discussed a commercial Solar Ordinance.
- Mr. Elston requested that the Planning Commission discuss short-term rentals at the next meeting.
- Updating the Township Comprehensive Plan will begin in Spring, 2024. This will include the scope of work, new land uses, and change in demographics.

Roads:

1. Line painting quotes will be requested for Pumpkin Hill Road.

Parks and Recreation:

- 2. Tree Lighting was held on December 3 from 3:30-5. Fire engines with Santa, cookies, children's craft, and a hot chocolate bar was provided by Tabathe Wallace.
- 3. Bollinger Road parking Mr. Daniel asked that the proposed parking spaces be expanded to an additional 50 spaces. Mr. Kologie advised that the next grant round opens in January with a maximum award of \$250,000.

- 4. CMS Pay Request #1 requested payment of \$97,493.53 for Pumpkin Hill Road repairs.

 Motion: Mr. Beam made a motion for conditional approval, pending receipt of required documents, of payment of \$97,493.53 to CMS for the Pumpkin Hill Road repairs and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.
- 5. <u>Road evaluation</u> –The following roads were identified for tar and chip repair: Heathrow Drive, Church Road, Coventry Cove, Adams Road, Huntsfield Drive, Stetson Drive, and the entrance to the Township Park. Bid documents are requested for March advertising.
- 6. <u>Auditor candidate</u> received notification from Chester County voter services that Linda Dierksheide was certified. If Ms. Dierksheide declines the nomination, four nominated candidates will be asked to consider the position.

BILLS: The bills to be paid this evening were reviewed.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Beam made the motion to pay the bills and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.
