Board of Supervisors Meeting November 11, 2019

<u>Opening:</u> Chairman Elston opened the regular scheduled meeting on Monday, November 11, 2019 at 7:00 P.M.

Roll call was taken and present were supervisors Gary C. Elston, Nelson R. Beam, and Frank V. Daniel, Jr. Others present were Kristin Camp, Solicitor, and Richard King, Maintenance.

<u>Public Comment</u>: Chairman Elston called for public comment on tonight's agenda; No public comment was received.

AUDIENCE:

• Debra Shulski on behalf of Renee Bentley – Explained that Ms. Bentley is interested in purchasing the 15 ½ acre parcel at 135 Wyebrook Road for a wedding/event venue. Ms. Shulski asked for feedback about the possibility of an ordinance amendment. Ms. Camp stated that a land development plan is required as this is zoned R-1 and DEP (Department of Environmental Protection) requirements must be met. Ms. Shulski was also advised to bring the proposal to a Planning Commission meeting for review.

- Chris Mauchline Honey Brook Library Mr. Mauchline thanked the township for their annual financial support. He also explained the capital campaign to expand the library to provide more programs to the community.
- <u>John Lentz on behalf of Jim Ford</u> Would like to be relieved of the requirement to provide a full preliminary plan for the conditional use application. Ms. Camp explained the benefits of providing the plan and that the application is not complete without the plan. Ms. Camp advised to review the Subdivision and Land Development Application (SALDO) and to contact her if there are questions.

<u>Abner Glick</u> – Asked if there was any progress in the possibility of an Amish school in West Nantmeal Township. Mr. Glick stated that the school would hold 30-35 students ages 6 to 14 and would not have inside plumbing. Ms. Camp stated that Ms. Venzie was waiting for specific properties that were of interest to assist in developing an ordinance.

REPORTS:

Engineering: The monthly report will be on file in the township office.

• Garage addition is near completion as most of the punch list items are done and electric has been installed.

Zoning Report: The monthly report will be on file in the township office.

- Zoning complaints are being addressed. Recent ones include 140 Barneston Road with horses on an inadequate parcel and 1032 N. Manor Road with an excessive amount of vehicles in the front yard. Issues with the timber harvest at 3071 Creek Road were also noted.
- Mr. Elston asked for a checklist of applicable inspections to be provided to applicants when permits are issued.
- Mr. Elston asked about the complaint from the owner of 163 Bollinger Road regarding excessive
 water runoff from the parcel above him. Mr. Kologie walked the property in the summer with
 the property owner to review his concerns.

Solicitor's Report:

Ms. Camp opened the Public Hearing at 8:12 PM regarding Ordinance 4-2019 Amending the West Nantmeal Township Stormwater Management and Erosion and Sediment Control Ordinance to

Planning Commission: No meeting in October

Roads:

- Road projects –All paving and repairs are completed. Bollinger road needs to be evaluated for paving inconsistencies.
- <u>Line Striping</u>—Mr. King received 2 quotes for striping Bollinger and Isabella Roads, and the township building parking lot.

Motion: Mr. Daniel made the motion to approve the quote from Fas-Stripe Co. for \$2,955.00 to provide line striping on Isabella Road between New and Woods Roads; Bollinger Road between N. Manor and Creek Roads; and parking spaces at the Township Building contingent on completion in 2019 and was seconded by Mr. Beam. Motion carried 3-0.

 <u>Road Barricades</u> – Mr. King would like to purchase 8 road barricades for emergency road closings.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Daniel made the motion to purchase 8 high reflective road barricades at a cost of \$119.00 each from Traffic Safety Company and was seconded by Mr. Beam. Motion carried 3-0.

Parks and Recreation:

- <u>Park signs</u> –Updated park signs were ordered from Cleverly deSigns and roofing shingles have been purchased to repair the wooden sign by the tennis courts.
- <u>Community Day:</u> Expenses were within budget at \$2,909.00 not including Mr. Daniel's and maintenance workers compensation. This will be included for budgeting purposes.
