Roads:

- Road mowing was completed by Josh Beam, and the tractor and road mower were repaired.
 <u>Motion</u>: Mr. Elston made the motion to pay Josh Beam \$23.00 per hour for assistance with road work and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 2-0 with Mr. Beam abstaining.
- Tree in right of way at 177 Bollinger Road has been removed.
- Additional repair quote for Bollinger Road Bridge is needed.
- Discussed concerns about drainage issues at 415 Chestnut Tree Road and swale maintenance.
- Mr. Elston has spoken with Chris Bonenberger who is the new Highway Maintenance Manager for PennDot in Chester County regarding road issues.

Parks and Recreation:

- 1. Diamond Tex was approved to be ordered for the ball fields and Matt Hahn will perform the remediation.
- 2. Discussed proposed temporary fencing around the ball fields for tournaments. Ms. Camp will provide a license agreement that may be used for the park.
- 3. Walking trails will be addressed with stone from Barneston Road street sweeping.
- 4. A committee meeting is planned to be held. Date to be announced.

Historic:

- 5 new members have joined the Commission because of the open house at Isabella Furnace. An August picnic is planned with the Wallace Township Historic Committee.
- Program on the Cowboys and King Ranch will be held at 2 PM on October 11 at St. Mary's.
- The Lewis Grist Mill on Bollinger Road has been stabilized by the Historic Commission and the property owner and a sign will be placed on the fence. Mr. Elston thanked the Commission for their efforts in the Township.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. <u>Chester County Landscapes 3</u> Rachel Griffith spoke on the County wide Comprehensive Plan and offered free technical assistance to update the Township ordinances to protect steep slopes, floodplains and wetlands, and riparian buffers. Mr. Elston stated that this would be taken under advisement.
- <u>Road paving change order</u> The change order from DiRocco Brothers for the paving of Bollinger and Wyebrook Roads shows a decrease of \$39,190.20.
 <u>Motion</u>: Mr. Beam made the motion to accept the change order from DiRocco Brothers and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.
- <u>Hammell-O'Donnell Business Park Extension</u> requested a six-month extension.
 <u>Motion</u>: Mr. Beam made the motion to approve a six-month extension until February 14, 2022, the Hammell-O'Donnell Subdivision and Land Development plan and was seconded by Mr. Elston. Motion carried 3-0.
- 4. <u>Hammell-O'Donnell Business Park proposed sale</u> Discussed the new buyer's proposal and possible issues with lighting, stormwater, and traffic concerns.
- <u>Aaron Stoltzfoos Stormwater Agreement</u> presented for Board approval.
 <u>Motion</u>: Mr. Daniel made the motion to approve the Stormwater Agreement for Aaron K. Stoltzfoos and Rachel Anne Stoltzfoos and was seconded by Mr. Beam. Motion carried 3-0.
- PennDot Winter Services Agreement 2021/2022 agreement was reviewed. <u>Motion:</u> Mr. Beam made the motion to accept the 2021/2022 PennDot Winter Services Agreement and was seconded by Mr. Daniel. Motion carried 3-0.
- 7. <u>PennDot Turnback Roads</u> Reviewed the change in funding method.
- 8. <u>American Recovery Plan</u>–Waiting for further clarification as to use of funds. Money Market account was opened at Victory Bank for the designated funds.
