- <u>Stormwater</u> DEP stormwater model ordinance must be adopted by September 30, 2022 after it is tailored to each municipality. This will involve changing the existing Township stormwater ordinance and will be addressed monthly until adoption.

#### **Planning Commission:**

- Reviewed the revisions to the Township sign ordinance and recommended approval.

## Roads:

#### **Parks and Recreation:**

- Soccer fields will be rolled to help level the ground. The soccer club will be asked for future assistance with the process.
