Engineering:

• Yoder Road culvert is now complete, and the road is open. Payment Request No. 2 for Joseph J Danielle LLC in the amount of \$266,888.97 minus the retainage (10%) of \$13,686.60 for a net payment of \$253,886.67.

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Elston made a motion to approve the payment of \$253,886.67 to Joseph J Danielle LLC for the Yoder Road Culvert project upon receipt of a payment memo from Castle Valley Consultants and was seconded by Mr. Beam. Motion carried 3-0.

Hammell-O'Donnell is working through the approval process. Mr. Kologie and Ms. Camp met
with West Brandywine and Honey Brook Townships to discuss the proposed traffic signal at
Chestnut Tree and Horseshoe Pike. Hammell-O'Donnell will recover costs from lot sales. West
Brandywine will take ownership of the traffic signal and will share costs with West Nantmeal
and Honey Brook Townships.

Zoning Report:

• 277 Killian Road – will continue to monitor property as it is eligible for condemnation.

Solicitor's Report: No report

Planning Commission:

Sketch plans were presented for Rouse Chamberlin, 11 Sweetwater Road, and Stoltzfus
Enterprises, 81 Sweetwater Road. A section of Sweetwater Road is not currently passable and
will need remediation. Both Rouse Chamberlin and Stoltzfus Enterprises will need a text
amendment for a zoning change.

Roads:

- Green Hollow Road inlet boxes were repaired.
- Honey Brook Township has completed the brush trimming of Township roads.
- Mr. Elston, on behalf of the Supervisors, thanked David Gardner and James Miller for their maintenance of the park and roads and working with Honey Brook Township on road trimming.

- Yoder Road will be evaluated for 2026 repairs. Mr. Kologie will look at repair options.
- 2026 Mack dump truck was delivered on September 4 and will replace the 2010 Freightliner.

Parks and Recreation:

- Music in the Park was well attended with free ice cream provided to the children. Three music
 events are planned for 2026, and sponsors will be secured to defray costs.
- Community Day-September 27- planning is on-going. The five founding members of the Park and Recreation Committee will be honored at the event.
